Gender Equity Taskforce Works to Address Harassment

A "[Gender Equity Town Hall](#)" at UCSF in the spring revealed that a disheartening 83% of participants had witnessed gender harassment over the course of their scientific careers. Sparked by the Town Hall and ensuing discussions, a group of 13 graduate students and one postdoc formed the Gender Equity Trainee Taskforce to improve gender equity and eliminate sexual harassment at UCSF.

An [article written by two of the students in the Taskforce](#), Emma Powell (Biochemistry program) and Camille Simoneau (BMS program), for *Synapse* outlined the group's recommendations to address culture and climate, improve transparency and accountability, and diffuse the hierarchical and dependent relationship between trainees and faculty.

The Graduate Division applauds these efforts and would like to encourage faculty members to review the [Taskforce recommendations](#) and work proactively to implement them.

UCSF Postdoc Receives Regeneron Prize

Kara McKinley, PhD, a postdoctoral scholar in the Department of Cellular and Molecular Pharmacology, is one of two recipients of the 7th annual Regeneron Prize for Creative Innovation. McKinley received the prestigious award – which includes a \$50,000 cash prize – at a ceremony on July 17.

McKinley received her PhD from MIT, after which she joined Ron Vale's lab at UCSF. "The Vale Lab is an extraordinary and inspiring place to do science and to grow as a scientist. Ron and the Vale lab members are incredible role models, and I am very lucky to work with them and learn from them," she said. "The collaborative spirit of UCSF has been instrumental to my postdoc. I collaborate closely with Ophir Klein's lab, which is a second home for me. On top of that, I have other wonderful mentors here, including Holly Ingraham, Dyche Mullins, and Jeff Bush, who have supported me, challenged me, and pushed my thinking in new directions.
