Funding Opportunity!

University of California-Hispanic Serving Institutions Doctoral Diversity Initiative

Launched in fall 2019, the UC-HSI DDI aims to enhance and expand faculty diversity and pathways to the professoriate for students from California's Hispanic Serving Institutions (HSIs). The Graduate Division would like to strongly encourage faculty to partner with colleagues at qualifying California State University campuses, most of which are HSIs, to apply for this new funding opportunity.

There are two award tiers. PIs will have the flexibility to define the length of their grant term – up to five years for large awards (up to \$350K), and up to two years for small awards (up to \$50K).
