### Graduate Student Petition

UCSF graduate students posted a petition on social media in mid-June 2020, calling on the Graduate Division to take a public stand against police brutality, especially against Black people and Black communities, as well as to bolster diversity and inclusion across the graduate programs. We were grateful for the invitation to engage with students and for the opportunity to focus on these crucially important issues.

The Graduate Division posted a [first response to the petition](#) (addressing demands one through three of 15 in the petition) on June 25, with supporting signatures from all but two graduate programs. We posted our [response to the students' remaining demands](#) on July 14. Please be encouraged to read the petition and response, [attend the related Town Hall](#) this Thursday (July 23) at 4 p.m., and join us in addressing the students' concerns through the work you do as faculty.

### Talking About Race and Inequity in Science

Due to the widespread disruption to research conferences and events worldwide during the COVID-19 pandemic, the Graduate Division and Office for Postdoctoral Scholars redirected funds from its travel awards to help UCSF PhD students and postdocs make their home environments more conducive to studying and working remotely.
